Along with conducting classes by conventional Chalk and Talk method, the teachers also take classes with digital equipments. They use Projector and Computer in the classroom.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college departments regularly conduct sessional examinations and class tests. The endsemester examination is conducted by the Dibrugarh University.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

Majuli College Literary Forum, a literary body of Majuli College, publishes a peer-reviewed research journal having annual periodicity called *Bodhidroom* for promoting research among faculty and students.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

945(Rs. 1,83,879/-) books on different subjects have been purchased for the library.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The college has an excellent management system for the development of human resources. Special training sessions are organized on a regular basis for students, teachers and staff. Such sessions include various skill-based courses, yoga, communication skills, computer skills, spiritual lectures and so on.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The college follows a transparent and methodical procedure for recruitment of faculty and staff. While faculties are recruited as per UGC norms and regulations, the rules of the state government are applied for employment of the staff.
