The college has initiated Certificate Course in Mask-Making and Satriya Dance and Music. These two subjects have been unique cultural practices in certain Vaishnavite satras of Majuli. Significantly, Sri Sri Chamoguri Satra of Majuli has been a major centre of the mask-making tradition. Getting a range of exposure, such indigenous practice of mask making, the craft usually made of bamboo and clay, is now creating a good market, national as well as international. On the other hand, the Satras have been preserving and practicing Satriya dance and music since the 16th century. Keeping in mind the enormous professional demand of the subjects, Majuli College started these innovative courses for rendering academic dimension on the subjects to a large number of aspirants.
